


Collection and drop-off hubs

What is the Giant Scarf Project?

The Giant Scarf project is a community focused initiative, inviting individuals and community groups across Preston to knit strips of a scarf in the colours of Preston North End FC. These individual strips will then be joined together to create one giant scarf. The scarf will be a physical representation of Preston's diverse community.

How to get involved

Collect a starter pack with everything you need from one of our knitting hubs across Preston (listed on the back). Then follow the instructions, and happy knitting!

Don't forget to drop your strip back off at one of our knitting hubs! The Giant Scarf Project is running until Spring 2025, so keep an eye on our social medias for the drop off deadlines.

Can a complete beginner get involved?

Absolutely! This project is designed for everyone to get involved, from experienced knitters to complete beginners, of all ages.

If you're a complete beginner, follow the guide in the knitting pack for guidance.

We'll also be holding drop-in sessions in city centre locations. (Keep an eye on both PNECET's and the National Football Museum's social media pages to see when and where these will be!)

Get creative!

Want to knit more than one strip? Great! Want to add a design which represents yourself or your group? Even better! As long as your strips meet the size requirements, be as creative as you like.

Got the knitting bug?

If you catch the knitting bug and want to make a regular-sized scarf of any colour, please do so! As part of the project we will be collecting these additional scarves for the Foxton Centre who will distribute them to those in need.
