

To get to Level 11 can take the escalator, stairs or lift.






















On Level 1, there are two toilets. They both have separate sinks.







called Football Plus + and I can buy tickets for them.












Some of the interactive games on Level 2 are free to play.




















Here is the exit when I want to leave the museum.


