WE TEACH EARLY YEARS...

WE TEACH HISTORY...

Pickles and the Stolen World Cup

Y1 - 2 / 1 hour / max. 35 children

Meet Pickles the dog and discover how he sniffed out the stolen world cup trophy in 1966. This interactive session uses puppets, role play and exploration of our 1966 World Cup collection.

Football and WW1

Y5 - 6 / 1 hour / max. 35 children

Find out about the controversial decision to suspend football, see who joined the footballers battalion and understand life for women footballers on the home front.

Animating History

Y6 / 90 mins / max. 15 children

Participate in our new creative session using innovative technology to animate local history using real museum objects. Pupils use time-lapse and stop-motion animation to create imaginative stories.

Trench Football

Y3 - 6 / 1 hour / max. 35 children

Discover more about football's role during the Great War and be inspired by our war time, morale-boosting football puzzles before creating your own.

Going to the Match

Y3 - 6 / 1 hour / max. 35 children

Explore the sights, smells and sounds of match days in the past. Pupils dress up in supporters' clothes, investigate museum objects and use role play to describe their experiences.

Football and Local History

Y2 - 5 / 1 hour / max. 35 children

Discover more about Manchester's rich footballing history. Learn about the highs and lows of United and City and the developments that have seen Manchester become the home of 2 of the world's largest clubs.

WE TEACH SCIENCE AND DESIGN...

Floodlights - The Power of Electricity

Y1 - 3 / 1 hour / max. 35 children

Winter brings dark evenings and football players can't see the ball. Problem solve as a team, learn about electricity, get hands on and build circuits to illuminate the game in this fun, interactive session.

Object Investigators

Y3 - 6 / 90 mins / max. 35 children

A mysterious trunk of objects has been donated to the Museum. Take on the role of a Conservator, handle the collection, identify materials, consider environmental requirements, carry out tests and interpret the objects to tell the story of its owner.

Designer Balls

Y5 - 6 / 90 mins / max. 35 children

Investigate how footballs have changed from pigs bladders to improvised balls around the world. Pupils get their hands on real artefacts and then design, make and test their own footballs from recycled materials.

WE TEACH MATHS AND LITERACY...

Football Poetry with Paul Cookson

Y3 - 6 / 1 hour / max. 60 children

Our popular performance poetry sessions with our award winning Poet in Residence, use the excitement of football to bring poetry to life.

First Division

Y5 - 6 / 1 hour / max. 15 children

Football and maths are the perfect team-mates! First Division uses football to deliver maths enrichment. Explore gallery interactives and have a go at practical drills to generate numbers which are used in a variety of activities.

Playmaker: Creative Football Writing

Y4 - 6 / 1 hour / max. 35 children

Create fantastic fictional football superstars and describe their famous first goals with children's author Matt Oldfield. Did the ball rocket into the top corner or skid past the goalkeeper? Was it a fantastic free kick or the perfect penalty?



FOOTBALL PLUS+

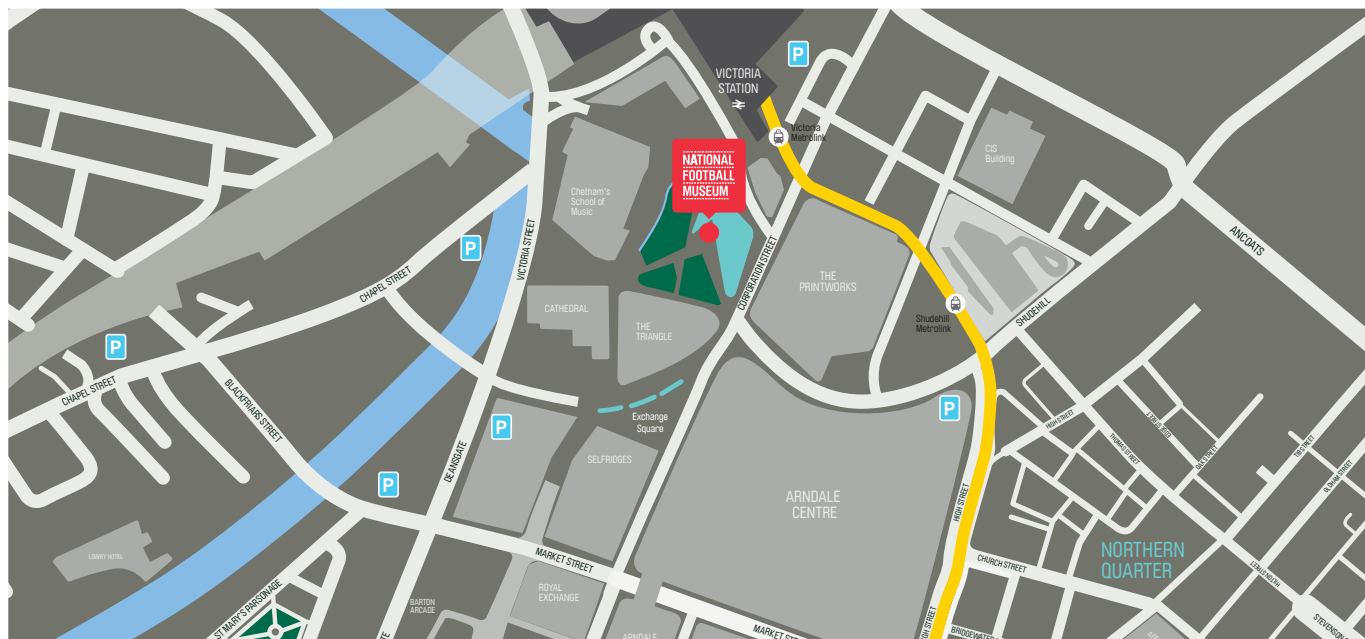

Lunch Space
