## WE TEACH HISTORY...

### Animating History

Y7 – 9 / 90 mins / max. 15 pupils

Take part in our creative session using innovative technology to animate local history using real museum objects. Pupils use time-lapse and stop-motion animation, to create imaginative stories.

### Football and WW1

Y7 – 8 / 1 hour / max. 35 pupils

Find out about the controversial decision to suspend football in 1915, see who joined the footballers' battalion and learn about the life of female footballers on the home front.

### Women, Football and Society

Y7 – 11 / 1 hour / max. 35 pupils

Discover the history of women's football from the 1890s to the present day. Take a look at a variety of historical sources and relive the past through drama – exploring topical ideas around democracy, equality and rights.

### Football in the Modern World

Y10 – 11 and Post 16 / 1 hour / max. 60 pupils

Explore the impact of commercialisation and socio-cultural influences on the evolution of football in our new session, ideal for GCSE PE groups.

## WE TEACH LITERACY AND NUMERACY...

### Football Poetry with Paul Cookson

Y7 – 9 / 1 hour / max. 60 pupils

These performance poetry sessions with our award winning Poet in Residence, use the excitement of football to bring poetry to life.

### First Division

Y7 – 11 / 1 hour / max. 15 pupils

This fun session is aimed at young people with low ability and confidence in maths, using football to engage them through practical activities that solve real life number problems.

### Good on Paper

Y7 – 11 / 1 hour / max. 20 pupils

Have a go at being a football commentator in our broadcast session. Focusing on literacy, public speaking and confidence, young people learn the techniques of sports journalism and commentary before having a go for themselves.

## WE TEACH DESIGN AND SCIENCE...

### Designer Balls

Y7 – 9 / 90 mins / max. 35 pupils

From pigs bladders to African condom footballs, investigate how footballs have changed. Pupils get to handle real artefacts, design and make their own footballs from recycled materials and put them to the test.

### Object Investigators

Y7 – 8 / 90 minutes / max. 35 pupils

Step into the shoes of a museum conservator and investigate what stories lay behind a treasure chest of donated objects. Get hands-on, identify materials, and think about preserving them for the future.



## WE TEACH MORE...

### Football, Leisure and Tourism

Y10 – 11 and Post 16 / 1 hour / max. 35 pupils

Discover the role of sports tourism to the UK economy and how the museum fits into this landscape through innovative marketing and exhibits.



### Guided Tours

1 hour / max. 20 pupils per tour

Take a closer look at the history of football with your own tour guide. Discover the stories behind our amazing objects including the 1966 World Cup Ball, Maradona's Hand of God shirt and the first ever England international shirt.

### British Values

1 hour self-guided trail / max. 20 pupils

Use the museum's unique collection to learn about football's relationship with the core values of democracy, rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance in this free museum trail, developed with Kick it Out.

Many of our sessions support the Artsmark and the Arts Award.



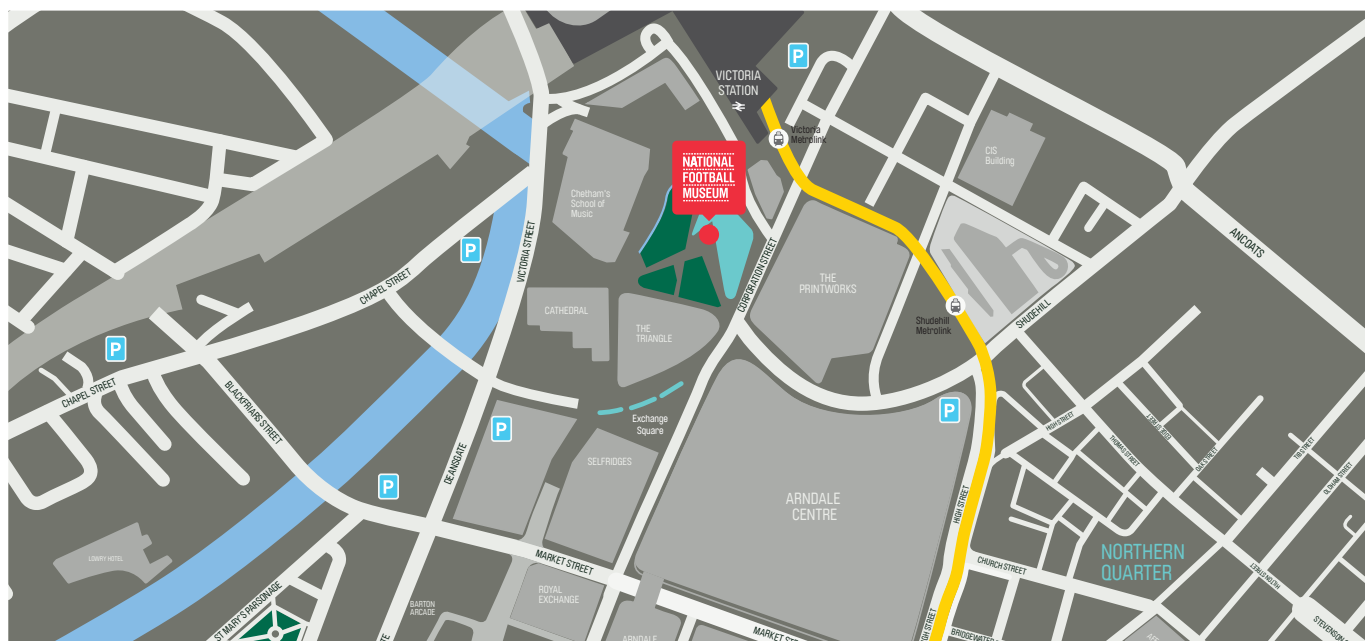
## FOOTBALL PLUS+
